Notes:

- Exam 1 will cover the material on the schedule up to and including Section 8.5.
 - Exam 2 will cover the material on the schedule up to and including Section 7.7.
 - The Final Exam will be cumulative but will emphasize the material from Sections 9.1-9.5 and 10.1-10.3.
 - **2 wks** - Remember: *Strict* deadline of two weeks before each exam for requesting exam accommodations.
- * Note that some material may be scheduled to be covered (or at least started) **before** an exam even though that material will not be tested on the exam. (E.g. many schedules will start Section 4.8 before Exam 1.) The first section representing material for the next exam is marked with an asterisk (*) on the calendar. When so scheduled, is important to cover material before the exam so that you do not fall behind schedule. However, WeBWorK deadlines for this material will not be until significantly *after* the exam. Note that this gives you a little flexibility in terms of which day(s) leading up to an exam you choose to use for review and which day(s) you choose to cover new material. (Sometimes splitting time available for review across more than one day of class (and covering new material during the other parts of those classes) works well.)
- + As discussed at the first course meeting, partial fractions (the beginning of Section 7.4) should also be covered during one of the days on which you are covering 7.1 and 7.2.
- “Review” Days are class days that you can choose to spend as seems most beneficial for your students. We do not recommend that you formally review the material for your students but rather that you answer their questions and have them work on interesting problems that you believe will help them solidify their understanding of and comfort with the material. As mentioned above, you have flexibility as far as which days you choose to use for “review” and can, for example, choose to split some class days between new material and review.
 - WeBWorK assignments will typically open a couple of (calendar) days before the day you are scheduled to start covering the material in class. The deadlines are typically 6 calendar days after the date on which you are scheduled to finish covering the material in class. (Exceptions include the time around exams and holidays.) Note that this means that most (but not all due to holidays, exams, etc.) WeBWorK is due the night before the days on which you have class.
 - Recall that there will be suggested problems for the entire semester.
